Sermon Notes: The Beyond in Our Midst

- 1. In 1944, the Lutheran pastor Dietrich Bonhoeffer wrote, "God's 'beyond' is not the beyond of our cognitive faculties [i.e., what we know]. God is the beyond in the midst of life."
- 2. The prophet Jeremiah, long before Bonhoeffer, likewise claims that God resides here: "Yet you, O Lord, are in the midst of us." No looking to heaven for God! According to 2 Timothy 4:17, Paul also experienced God's presence close by as the source of strength that enabled him to face persecution.
- 3. What is it about these people that empowered them to persist in the face of hardship? The answer is faith—not a belief in God's existence but the experience of being empowered by something deeper than oneself to press onward and persevere, convinced that God is present.
- 4. Though not like those faced by Paul, Jeremiah or Bonhoeffer, Queen Anne Lutheran Church has its obstacles too. How is God present to us? I believe in *at least* three ways—these ways bring God's love into the world, they incarnate God, they make God real and they presuppose the power of God working through us.
- 5. God is the beyond in the midst of life—may you recognize His presence around you, and may you be empowered by it to live for others, serve and persevere.
