Suggested open ended questions based on Godly Play are listed below. And remember, there are no right or wrong answers.

- I wonder which part of the story you liked best? Least?
- I wonder if there's something that surprised or puzzled you in this story?
- I wonder if there's a character in the story you find interesting?
- I wonder which part of the story is the most important?
- I wonder what we learn about God in this story?
- I wonder which part of the story is about you?
- I wonder what God 's trying to tell or teach us in this story?
- Is there something you wonder about?
- I wonder which part of the story might be a big point to remember?
