Silence for reflection and self-examination.


- **P**: Most merciful God,

- **G**: Amen.




The ministration of the Sacrament will take place in the pews with individual elements. These are available as you enter; if you missed picking one up and need one, please signal an usher now with a raised hand.

For All the Saints (SINE NOMINE) G. Winston Cassler (1906–1990)

About today's music

You've likely noticed that oftentimes a hymn-based piano or organ piece includes a name that differs from the first line of the hymn text. Today, for example, DUKE STREET and SINE NOMINE are featured. These are *tune names*, differentiated by the use of small capital letters (see the information beneath each hymn in ELW, for example). The composer of DUKE STREET, John Hatton (d. 1793), lived in the town of Windle, England, and his famous tune is named for the street on which he lived. Ralph Vaughan Williams (1872–1958) composed SINE NOMINE specifically for the text of "For All the Saints" (ELW 422). It first appeared in *The English Hymnal* (1906), replacing what was regarded as a lackluster Victorian tune for the same hymn. Interestingly, sine nomine means "without a name." Vaughan Williams may have chosen this moniker for his newly-composed hymn tune in deference to a Renaissance tradition of titling musical settings of the Mass "without a name" if they were not based on previous material. The tune for ELW 502 is named for St. Columba (521-597), the Irish saint who brought Christianity to Scotland. Vaughan Williams is credited with some slight alterations to this Irish tune for its inclusion in *The English Hymnal* with "The King of Love My Shepherd Is." – Cantor Kyle

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
