I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.





We confess and believe that Christ in his risen form is truly present in the Sacrament of bread and wine and that by sharing in this meal, we share in Christ's resurrection.


The ministration of the Sacrament will take place in the pews with individual elements. These are available as you enter; if you missed picking one up and need one, please signal an usher now with a raised hand.

Chorale prelude for organ and trumpet on WACHET AUF, RUFT UNS DIE STIMME Johann Ludwig Krebs (1713–1780)

About today's music

We close our Advent season of preparation with a melody heard during the prelude at the First Sunday of Advent. Today's postlude is one of the several settings of WACHET AUF, RUFT UNS DIE STIMME (ELW 436) for organ and solo instrument by Johann Ludwig Krebs (1713–1780). Krebs studied in Leipzig at the St. Thomas Church with Johann Sebastian Bach (1685–1750). Like his mentor, Krebs composed a significant output of church music for organ, choir, and instruments. Perhaps because his compositional style stayed closer to the earlier fashions of Bach and the Baroque, his music fell into relative obscurity until the 1900s. — *Cantor Kyle*
