On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come again to judge the living and the dead.



We confess and believe that Christ in his risen form is truly present in the Sacrament of bread and wine and that by sharing in this meal, we share in Christ's resurrection.


The ministration of the Sacrament will take place in the pews with individual elements. These are available as you enter; if you missed picking one up and need one, please signal an usher now with a raised hand.



Chorale variations on IN DIR IST FREUDE (ELW 867) J. S. Bach (1685–1750)

## About today's music

Johann Pachelbel (1653–1706) is perhaps best known for the famous "Canon in D." But he also composed much music for organ, including hymn-based music. Today's prelude includes part of his *partita* (a collection of short variations) based on the chorale melody, WAS GOTT TUT, DAS IST WOHLGETAN. The chorale melody takes its name from the hymn associated with it, translated as "What God Ordains Is Always Good." Composer K. Lee Scott (b. 1950) ingeniously adapts portions of Pachelbel's partita as the accompaniment for a paraphrase of Psalm 89 (heard at today's 10:30 service). Today's postlude is a short, sprightly setting of IN DIR IST FREUDE (today's hymn of the day, "In Thee Is Gladness," ELW 867) by J.S. Bach (1685–1750). Bach captures a sense of joyful, perpetual motion, with flourishes that seem to dance around the chorale melody. — *Cantor Kyle*


#### ANNUAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING TODAY AFTER 10:30 WORSHIP
