We confess and believe that Christ in his risen form is truly present in the Sacrament of bread and wine and that by sharing in this meal, we share in Christ's resurrection.


The ministration of the Sacrament will take place in the pews with individual elements. These are available as you enter; if you missed picking one up and need one, please signal an usher now with a raised hand.





Jubilate Olufela Obafunmilayo "Fela" Sowande (1905–1987)

About today's music

Today's postlude is by Chief Olufela Obafunmilayo "Fela" Sowande (1905–1987). The son of a Nigerian Anglican priest in the southwestern city of Aboketa, Sowande's childhood musical influences included his father (a pioneer of Nigerian church music in his own right) as well as organist and choirmaster Dr. T. K. Ekundayo Phillips, who is regarded as the first composer of sacred music incorporating the Yoruba language and indigenous musical idiom.

Sowande's early education included secondary school at King's College, Lagos. Continuing his studies abroad, he received the Bachelor of Music degree from the University of London and became a Fellow of the Trinity College of Music. In Britain, Sowande's music career spanned choral, band, church organ, and theater organ; he appeared as a piano soloist for George Gershwin's *Rhapsody in Blue*; he performed as a duo with pianist Fats Waller; and, during World War II, he composed music for the British Ministry of Information. From 1945 he was the organist and choirmaster at the West London Mission of the Methodist Church; much of his organ music was composed there, often drawing from Nigerian music and the pentatonic (five-note) scales of the Yoruba people of West Africa. After a stint with the BBC Africa Service, in 1953 Sowande returned to Nigeria to work for the Nigerian Broadcasting Corporation.

By the mid-1960s, Sowande's musical and academic career included multiple appearances as a concert organist in major U.S. cities, an appointment as a visiting professor at Northwestern University, and research grants from the Ford Foundation and from the Nigerian government. He moved permanently to the U.S. in 1968 to teach at Howard University, later at the University of Pittsburgh, and finally Kent State University. Following his retirement in 1982, Sowande and his wife, Eleanor McKinney, remained in Ohio until his death in 1982. Sowande composed music in multiple genres (organ, choral, orchestral, solo) and authored four books. He is regarded as one of the most famous African composers of works in the Western "classical" idiom.
