

This is the day that the LORD has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it." God has indeed raised from the dead the one who was put to death "by hanging him on a tree." *Alleluia!*

God allows Jesus to appear "to us who were chosen by God as witnesses" in holy baptism and invites us to eat and drink at the table of the risen Christ. *Alleluia!*

†THANKSGIVING FOR BAPTISM

P: Blessed be the holy Trinity,

→ one God, the fountain of living water, the mother who gave us birth, our light and our salvation.

G: Amen.

P: God, who is rich in mercy and love, gives us a new birth into a living hope through the sacrament of baptism.
By water and the Word, God delivers us from sin and death and raises us to new life in Jesus Christ.
We are united with all the baptized in the one body of Christ, anointed with the gift of the Holy Spirit, and joined in God's mission for the life of the world.

G: Amen.

PRESENTATION FOR BAPTISM

Sponsors, Ashley and Derek:

We present Caerwyn Lewis for baptism.

P: Alaina and Ryley, called by the Holy Spirit, trusting in the grace and love of God, do you desire to have your child baptized into Christ?

Response: We do.

P: As you bring your child to receive the gift of baptism, you are entrusted with responsibilities: to live with him among God's faithful people, bring him to the word of God and the holy supper, teach him the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments, place in his hands the holy scriptures, and nurture him in faith and prayer, so that he may learn to trust God, proclaim Christ through word and deed, care for others and the world God made, and work for justice and peace.

P: Do you promise to help Caerwyn grow in the Christian faith and life? *Response:* I do.

P: Ashley and Derek, as sponsors, do you promise to nurture Caerwyn in the Christian faith as you are empowered by God's Spirit, and to help him live in the covenant of baptism and in communion with the church?

Response: I do.

The presiding minister addresses the assembly:

P: People of God, do you promise to support Caerwyn and pray for him in his new life in Christ?

G: We do.

↑PROFESSION OF FAITH

P: I ask you to profess your faith in Christ Jesus, reject sin, and confess the faith of the church.

P: Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God?

Response: I renounce them.

P: Do you renounce the powers of this world that rebel against God? *Response*: I renounce them.

P: Do you renounce the ways of sin that draw you from God? *Response*: I renounce them.

Addressing all assembled:

P: Do you believe in God the Father?

G: I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

P: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

☑: I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

P: Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

■: I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

P: The Lord be with you.

P: Caerwyn Cassidy Lewis, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, Amen.

in the unity of the Holy Spirit, now and forever.

G: Blessed be God, the source of all life, the word of salvation, the spirit of mercy.

P: Let us pray.

We give you thanks, O God, that through water and the Holy Spirit you give your children new birth, cleanse them from sin, and raise them to eternal life.

Laying both hands on the head of the newly baptized, the minister prays for each:

P: Sustain Caerwyn with the gift of your Holy Spirit: the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord, the spirit of joy in your presence, both now and forever.

G: Amen.

The presiding minister marks the sign of the cross on the forehead of the newly baptized.

P: Caerwyn, child of God, you have been sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever.

G: Amen.

A lighted candle is given to the newly baptized as a representative of the congregation says:

A: Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven.

A: Let us welcome the newly baptized.

We welcome you into the body of Christ and into the mission we share; join us in giving thanks and praise to God and bearing God's creative and redeeming Word to all the world.

P: Blessed are you, O Source of the universe.

For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, now and forever.

Holy Communion — All baptized Christians who seek a taste of the new and forgiven life in Jesus Christ are welcome to receive the Sacrament.

We confess and believe that Christ in his risen form is truly present in the Sacrament of bread and wine and that by sharing in this meal, we share in Christ's resurrection.

The ministration of the Sacrament will take place in the pews with individual elements. These are available as you enter; if you missed picking one up and need one, please signal an usher now with a raised hand.

When invited to commune, peel off the bottom tab to eat the bread; peel off the top tab to drink the wine. The waste can go in the paper bag found in each pew.



Toccata (from *Symphony for Organ No. 5*) Charles-Marie Widor (1844–1937)

ABOUT TODAY'S MUSIC

The Toccata from *Symphony for Organ No. 5* by Charles-Marie Widor (1844–1937) is one of the most famous and beloved pieces for organ. (*Toccata* is from the Italian word "to touch" —a toccata is a piece that requires dexterity.) It's often heard at major festivals, perhaps especially at Easter. Its exuberance is indeed fitting for the most triumphant and celebratory day of the Christian calendar. Widor uses florid arpeggios to imply a melody, or as an accompaniment over bold melodic statements in the pedals. The "Widor Toccata" proved so influential that others borrowed from its construction for their own works, creating a subgenre of French Romantic toccatas by prominent composers such as Gigout, Boëllmann, Vierne, and Dupré.
