

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.





**Holy Communion** — All baptized Christians who seek a taste of the new and forgiven life in Jesus Christ are welcome to receive the sacraments. We confess and believe that Christ in his risen form is truly present in the Sacrament of bread and wine and that by sharing in this meal, we share in Christ's resurrection.

The ministration of the Sacrament is given in two ways:

### In the pew:

You may commune in the pews with individual elements. These are available in the narthex as you enter.

When invited to commune, peel off the bottom tab to eat the bread; peel off the top tab to drink the wine. The waste can go in the paper bag found in each pew.

### By intinction:


Come down the center aisle; please sanitize your hands. Receive a wafer in your hands. Dip it in a chalice, either wine or grape juice, before partaking. Continue to your right and use the outside aisle to return to your seat.

If you prefer to receive only bread, be assured that you are receiving the full presence of God.



# **About Today's Music:**

At the 10:30 service, we close the 50 days of Easter with the same final hymn we sang on Easter Sunday, "Thine Is the Glory" (ELW 376). The text is a French hymn dating to 1885, translated into English in 1925. It's paired with a melody by the great Baroque composer of the *Messiah*, George Frideric Handel (1685–1759). An *oratorio* is a large-scale work for orchestra and choir, usually on a religious theme. The tune, JUDAS MACCABEAUS, is named for Handel's oratorio of the same title. This work dramatizes the Jewish rebellion against oppression by the Seleucid Empire (the Maccabean Revolt, roughly 160 years before the time of Christ), with a libretto based on the apocryphal book of 1 Maccabees. In the oratorio, the tune is associated with a celebration of temporal victory; the Easter hymn speaks to eternal *Christus victor* themes.
