





By intinction:





About Today's Music:

Today's prelude and postlude are based on Luther's Pentecost hymn from about 1524, "Come, Holy Ghost, God and Lord" (ELW 395), an extended hymn by Luther based on a shorter text. Paul Westermeyer writes, "This is one of the finest hymns from the Lutheran heritage, a potent chorale that summarizes many of the Holy Spirit's attributes—love, brightness, light, guide, teacher, fire, comfort—and spins out graphic petitions from them." Lutheran composer and organist Matthias Weckmann (1616–1674) interprets each stanza with chorale variations. Writing before the height of the Baroque era in Bach's day, the listener might perceive Weckmann's musical idiom as sounding a bit more "medieval." At today's 10:30 service, the choir offers a meditative anthem at Communion on a Pentecost text with original music by Aaron David Miller (b. 1972), who presented the concert and hymn festival here at QALC on May 15.
