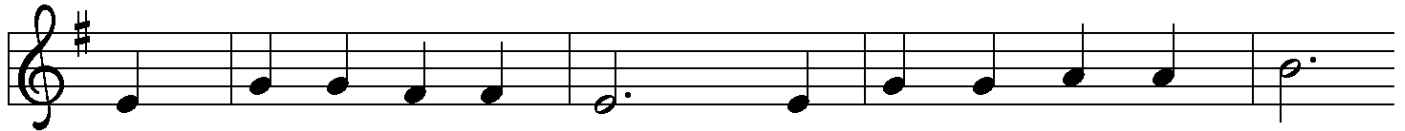

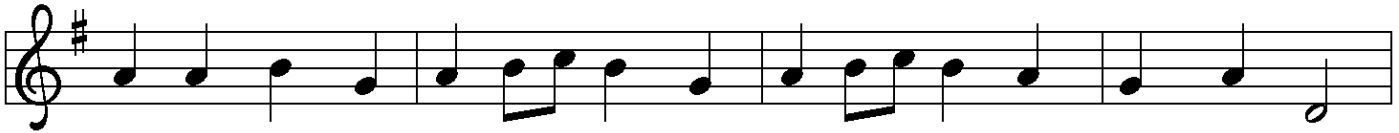

Holy Communion – All baptized Christians who seek a taste of the new and forgiven life in Jesus Christ are welcome to receive the sacraments. We confess and believe that Christ in his risen form is truly present in the Sacrament of bread and wine and that by sharing in this meal, we share in Christ’s resurrection.

The ministration of the Sacrament is given in two ways:

In the pew:

You may commune in the pews with individual elements. These are available in the narthex as you enter.

When invited to commune, peel off the bottom tab to eat the bread; peel off the top tab to drink the wine. The waste can go in the paper bag found in each pew.

By intinction:

Come down the center aisle; please sanitize your hands. Receive a wafer in your hands. Dip it in a chalice, either wine or grape juice, before partaking. Continue to your right and use the outside aisle to return to your seat.

If you prefer to receive only bread, be assured that you are receiving the full presence of God.



About Today's Music:

Our Hymn of the Day is Martin Luther's 1539 hymn on the Lord's Prayer. (ELW 746; see also the complete version, ELW 747). It's often new to our modern context, and may be unfamiliar to you. Give it your best try, and don't worry if the shape of the melody seems a little different than what you're accustomed to. (Scholars think the tune might be derived from an earlier medieval Czech melody.) Perhaps imagine what it may have been like in Luther's day, gathering in community around music at home and in worship, learning hymns by rote for a deeper shared understanding of the Lord's Prayer and the Gospel itself. Today's postlude is a vibrant treatment of the VATER UNSER ("Our Father") tune by Lutheran Baroque composer Georg Böhm (1661–1733).
