### In the pew:


You may commune in the pews with individual elements. These are available in the narthex as you enter.

### By intinction:







## **About Today's Music**

At the American Guild of Organists National Convention this past July, Dr. Pamela Ruiter-Feenstra opened her concert held here at QALC with one of Franz Tunder's (1614–1667) several organ preludes written in the key of G minor. This inspired me to order Tunder's collected works, and I'll be playing selections throughout the coming months, including today's postlude. Tunder was a North German Lutheran organist and composer who is regarded as an important link from earlier music of the Baroque era to the later Baroque style, which culminated in the works of J.S. Bach. Unfortunately, none of his music was published in his lifetime, and most of his output is lost. What survives is from a personal collection assembled by Gustav Düben (c. 1625–1690), a German-trained Swedish organist and composer who amassed some 2300 music manuscripts representing about 300 composers. The Düben collection languished in obscurity at the Royal Library in Upsala, Sweden, until it was catalogued in the 1880s and Tunder's music was rediscovered.
