

Holy Communion – All baptized Christians who seek a taste of the new and forgiven life in Jesus Christ are welcome to receive the sacrament. We confess and believe that Christ in his risen form is truly present in the Sacrament of Bread and Wine and that by sharing in this meal, we share in Christ’s risen presence among us.

The ministration of the Sacrament is given in two ways:

In the pew:

You may commune in the pews with individual elements. These are available in the narthex as you enter.

When invited to commune, peel off the bottom tab to eat the bread; peel off the top tab to drink the wine. The waste can go in the paper bag found in each pew.

By intinction:

When prompted by the ushers, come down the center aisle to kneel at the railing; please sanitize your hands. Receive a wafer in your hands. Dip it in a chalice, either wine or grape juice, before partaking. Use the outside aisle to return to your seat.

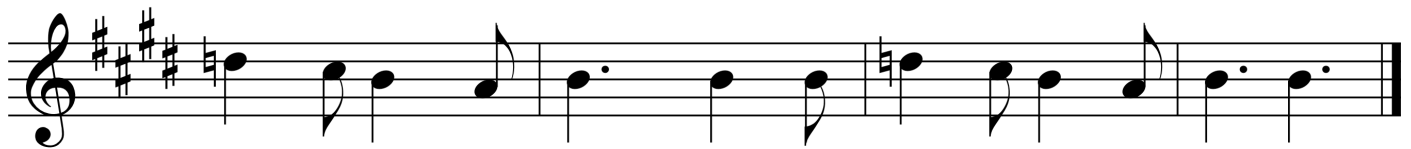

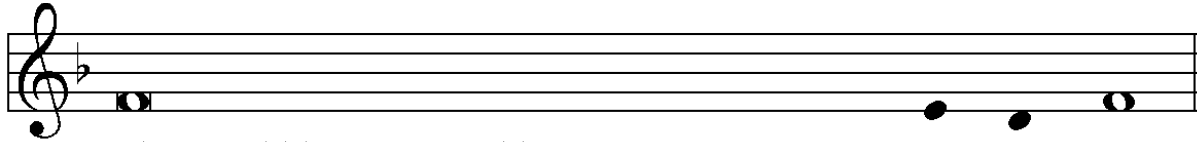

About Today's Music

Today's Hymn of the Day, both the text and the music, is by Bernadette Farrell (b. 1957). Farrell is a liturgical composer in Great Britain, active since the Second Vatican Council. She is known for her music written for children as well as for her numerous hymn tunes – perhaps especially those written for Shirley Erena Murray (see ELW 397). In Farrell's text for "Christ, Be Our Light" (ELW 715), hymnologist Paul Westermeyer notes a "priestly yearning." The hymn "is structured so that the stanzas press from longing for signs of the kingdom of God to us as its servants and signs."
