The ministration of the Sacrament is given in two ways:


In the pew:

You may commune in the pews with individual elements. These are available in the narthex as you enter.

When invited to commune, peel off the bottom tab to eat the bread; peel off the top tab to drink the wine. The waste can go in the paper bag found in each pew.

By intinction:

When prompted by the ushers, come down the center aisle to kneel at the railing; please sanitize your hands. Receive a wafer in your hands. Dip it in a chalice, either wine or grape juice, before partaking. Use the outside aisle to return to your seat.



About Today's Music

The German hymn "Beautiful Savior" (ELW 838) is a favorite of many (also known in another translation as "Fairest Lord Jesus"). The folk tune comes from Silesia, a region of central Europe that has Polish and German heritage; the melody was first connected with the text in 1842; the words can be traced to a 1677 hymnal in Münster, Germany, paired with a markedly different tune that fell into obscurity. F. Melius Christansen (1871–1955), the founder and conductor of the St. Olaf Choir at St. Olaf College, wrote a choral arrangement that became the ensemble's trademark and has been included on the choir's tour programs for more than a century.
