
In the pew:

When invited to commune, peel off the bottom tab to eat the bread; peel off the top tab to drink the wine. The waste can go in the paper bag found in each pew.







About Today's Music

Two ancient and famous hymns are featured in our worship services each week of Advent, connecting us to the observance of Advent across the centuries. At both services, we sing a different stanza of "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel" (ELW 257) each week. This hymn is based on the "O" antiphons that date to the eighth century or earlier. The "O" antiphons are so named because each begins with the vocative "O" (as in, "O come"). A different antiphon is intended to be sung with the Magnificat at Vespers from December 17 to 23. By the thirteenth century, a hymn based on these antiphons was written and it was paired with a fifteenth-century French melody when first published in English in 1854. At the 10:30 service, our Gathering Hymn is the first stanza and an additional stanza from "Savior of the Nations, Come" (ELW 263), described as "one of the longest-running hymns in the church." The text dates to Ambrose of Milan (340-397) and was translated by Martin Luther (1483–1546), probably for use in Advent of 1523. The tune was adapted from chant by Luther and his musical collaborator Johann Walter (1496-1570). - Cantor Kyle


