When invited to commune, peel off the bottom tab to eat the bread; peel off the top tab to drink the wine. The waste can go in the paper bag found in each pew.


#### By intinction:




#### **About Today's Music**

The Gathering Hymn for the 10:30 service is "Oh, Sing to God Above" (ELW 555). The words and the music of the hymn are by Carlos Rosas (b. 1939), with an English translation prepared for *With One Voice* (1995). Born in Mexico, Rosas became a U.S. citizen in 1968. In San Antonio (the hometown of his wife, Maria Teresa De Leon), he started a choir at San Juan de Los Lagos Catholic Church – where five singers soon grew to seventy, plus a mariachi band. The melody of the hymn is in a minor key, which in our dominant contemporary culture can have connotations of sadness or even danger. But historically in Western music – and in Rosas's Mexican culture – this need not be the case. Hymnologist Paul Westermeyer notes that this hymn tune "is not like the demonic D minor of Mozart's *Don Giovanni*. It is like the G minor rocket theme of the Finale of Mozart's *Symphony 40*, transposed to D minor and given a lilt." In singing this hymn, the key of D minor is "transformed to the celebrative trajectory of *Alleluia*."
