**The Apostles' Creed** emphasizes the full humanity of Christ (e.g., he was born, suffered, and died) in response to one of the earliest heresies, namely, the view that Christ only "appeared" to be human. Why? Detractors believed that the Spirit of God, which is good, could not dwell in a material or physical body, which is evil. When we profess the Apostles' Creed, following Jewish tradition, we insist otherwise. The world God made is good! With great joy and without contradiction, therefore, we can say with John 1:14 that "the Word became flesh and dwelled among us." -Pastor Dan







#### **About Today's Music**

Today's Gathering Hymn, "Day by Day" (ELW 790) is by Swedish author and editor Carolina "Lina" Sandell Berg (1832-1903). Recognized in her youth for her writing talent and translation skills (English, French German), she gained employment while still young and unmarried at the publishing house of the Swedish Evangelical Mission (an unusual arrangement for an unmarried woman of her era). She faced several hardships during her life, including a sickly childhood, the loss of both of her parents while she was still in her twenties, a stillborn child (her only offspring), and a business scandal that landed her husband in jail—yet her faith persevered at every turn. Her output of hymns was prodigious, with more than two thousand written during her lifetime (and no fewer than 650 published in three collections). "Day by Day" was first published in the two-hundred-page devotional calendar she edited annually for more than three decades; the hymn was part of an illustrated story about a clock that must learn to keep working a day at a time – trusting new grace, strength, and help to be given each day.
