I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead.

The Apostles' Creed emphasizes the full humanity of Christ (e.g., he was born, suffered, and died) in response to one of the earliest heresies, namely, the view that Christ only "appeared" to be human. Why? Detractors believed that the Spirit of God, which is good, could not dwell in a material or physical body, which is evil. When we profess the Apostles' Creed, following Jewish tradition, we insist otherwise. The world God made is good! With great joy and without contradiction, therefore, we can say with John 1:14 that "the Word became flesh and dwelled among us."

You may commune in the pews with individual elements. These are available in the narthex as you enter.


When invited to commune, peel off the bottom tab to eat the bread; peel off the top tab to drink the wine. The waste can go in the paper bag found in each pew.

Receive a wafer in your hands. Dip it in a chalice, either wine or grape juice, before partaking. Use the outside aisle to return to your seat.



#### **About Today's Music**

Today's prelude is a setting of the Lutheran Advent hymn "Nun komm, der Heiden Heiland" (Savior of the Nations, Come ELW#263) by J.S. Bach, written when he was cantor at St. Thomas, Leipzig. The hymn itself dates from 1524 with words by Martin Luther and a tune based on a Medieval hymn by Ambrose, "Veni redemptor gentium". Bach's setting of the chorale tune is highly ornamented, while the accompaniment contains musical motifs that allude to Christ's birth, crucifixion and our redemption. Listen in the first half for a "rocking cradle" motif in the lowest voice (pedal line) signifying Christ's birth. In the second half, one can hear a repeated "sighing" motif of descending notes that signifies the burden of our sins. In the middle voices listen for the tune "O Sacred Head, Now Wounded" (Herzlich tut mich verlangen). (Insights thanks to David Dahl, emeritus professor of organ, PLU, from masterclasses with organist and Bach interpreter Anton Heiller.) The postlude is a chorale harmonization by J.S. Bach of "Gottes Sohn ist kommen" (Once he came in blessing, LBW #312) and a setting by his cousin, Johann G. Walther. — Martha Freitag

# FORUM TODAY AT 9 AM: Update on Twegashe School / CORE Tanzania

After Michael and Jeannette Banobi, QALC members, visited Michael's village in Tanzania in 2015 and found that the village school wasn't adequate to provide success for its students, they formed a non-profit to build a new school. Twegashe Primary School is now providing a high-quality, participatory education with classes taught in English to give children a better chance of success in secondary school. In April 2022 they began construction on Phase 2 of the school, with five more classrooms and additional teacher housing. This new phase will allow expansion from pre-K through grade 7 (the last year of primary school in
