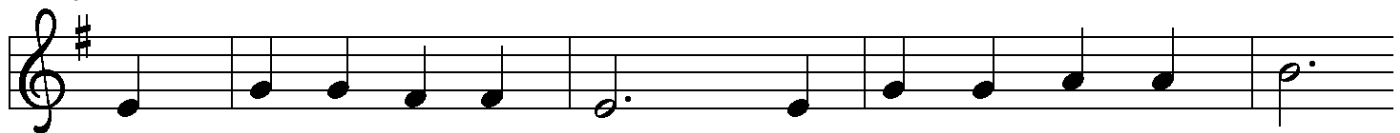

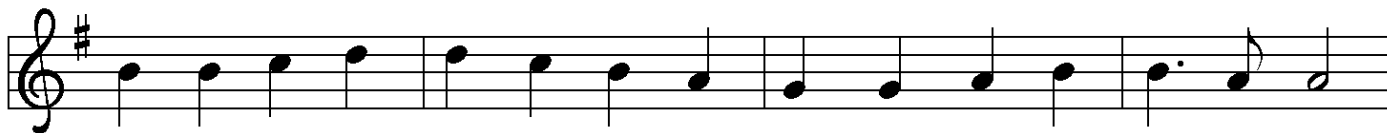

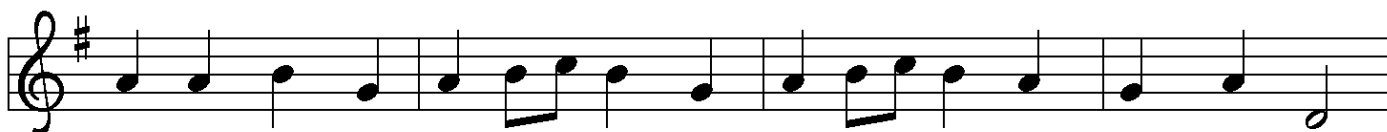

The Apostles' Creed emphasizes the full humanity of Christ (e.g., he was born, suffered, and died) in response to one of the earliest heresies, namely, the view that Christ only "appeared" to be human. Why? Detractors believed that the Spirit of God, which is good, could not dwell in a material or physical body, which is evil. When we profess the Apostles' Creed, following Jewish tradition, we proclaim otherwise. The world God made is good! With great joy and without contradiction, therefore, we can say with John 1:14 that "the Word became flesh and dwelled among us."

Holy Communion –

All who seek a taste of the new and forgiven life in Jesus Christ are welcome to receive the sacrament. We confess and believe that Christ, who fills all things, come to us in a special way through the Sacrament of Bread and Wine, and that by sharing in this meal, we share in Christ's real presence among us.

The ministration of the Sacrament is given in two ways:

In the pew:

You may commune in the pews with individual elements. These are available just inside as you enter the sanctuary. When invited to commune, peel off the bottom tab to eat the bread; peel off the top tab to drink the wine. Place the waste in the paper bag in your pew.

By intinction:

When prompted by the ushers, come down the center aisle to kneel at the railing; please sanitize your hands.

Receive a wafer in your hands. Dip it in a chalice, either wine or grape juice, before partaking. Use the outside aisle to return to your seat.

About Today's Music

Sometimes it's trickier to coordinate Sunday hymns to the themes and topics found in the day's readings. The Hymn of the Day often ties into the Gospel reading, and so today's verses about John the Baptist's demise present a special challenge! "Give Thanks for Saints" (ELW 428) is a modern hymn text that points us to the examples of those in every time and place who have remained true to their faith, even in challenging or life-threatening circumstances (and this would certainly include John the Baptist). The Sending Hymn, "Lord, Keep Us Steadfast in Your Word" (ELW 517), written by Martin Luther, reminded the people of his day to stay the course amid the temporal and spiritual challenges they faced. By extension, Luther invites us to consider our pilgrim path as we seek to live lives that are "steadfast" in Christ. What do you think? Do today's hymns help tie together this morning's themes?
